FOR AGES 1 MONTH - 5.5 YEARS



Developmental screening in early childhood is essential for identifying areas where a child might need additional support. It allows families to connect with community resources early, supporting long-term growth and development.

Screening is beneficial for every child! Your answers will help show your child's strengths and areas where they might need further support.

Partnering with Families

We believe that building strong partnerships with families is important for every child's growth and success. We work closely with you to support your child's learning journey. We offer a range of resources giving your child the tools they need to thrive. Together, we can create a caring environment where every child can reach their full potential.



What is the ASQ?

The ASQ is a questionnaire designed to help you track your child's development. This reliable, research based tool helps families understand how children are growing in key areas like:

- **COMMUNICATION**
- **PHYSICAL ABILITIES**
- **SOCIAL SKILLS**
- **PROBLEM-SOLVING**

How does the ASQ work?

MANY OPTIONS: Parents or other trusted adults (with parent permission) can fill out the form on paper, online, or together with a trained screener.

EASY & FUN: This 10-15 minute questionnaire can be completed with the help of fun activities using simple household materials that we can provide.

RESULTS: You get immediate results! These can be passed on to physicians, schools, and associated services at the parent's request.





Helping Your Child Grow:

Simple Screenings to Support Their Development

With the **ASQ-3** and **ASQ-SE-2** screenings, parents get a complete look at how their child is growing.

ASQ-3: The ASQ-3 helps families understand how a child is developing in several areas:

- Communication: Talking, understanding, language
- Physical Abilities: Moving, coordinating, fine motor skills
- Social Skills: Interacting with others
- **Problem-Solving Skills:** Thinking critically

ASQ-SE-2: The ASQ-SE-2 focuses on a child's social and emotional growth, including:

- **Emotional Regulation:** Handling feelings and behaviors
- **Social Communication:** Engaging with family and friends
- Adaptability: Adjusting to new places or situation
